CRD aims to work for ensuring the environmental and ecological sustainability, equity, democracy and prosperity in rural society.



SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT TOWARDS VALUE CHAIN APPROACH

3 projects have been implemented in this field:

- Project “Providing technical production assistance to farmers and developing production co-operatives in An Nhơn town and Vĩnh Sơn commune, Bình Định province” funded by Central Group Vietnam.
- Project “Developing value chain of Dwarf Banana in A Lưới district, Thừa Thiên Huế province” funded by Central Group Vietnam.
- Project “Strengthening capacity on forest resources and biodiversity conservation in association with sustainable livelihood development for ethnic minorities living near the Saola Nature Reserve” funded by the Global Environment Facility and the Small Grants Programme of the United Nations Development Program in Vietnam.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT TOWARDS VALUE CHAIN APPROACH

Achievements:

- 605 people have benefited from activities in Thừa Thiên Huế and Bình Định province.
- 11 training courses on cultivation, animal husbandry, production techniques, co-operatives operation and management were conducted with the participation of 450 people .
- 9 technical handbooks was compiled on the process of Ra Dư rice cultivation; semi-intensive cow breeding; growing Homalomena under natural forest canopy, temperate vegetables farming (e.g. cabbage, chinese cabbage, radish and sweet pepper, etc.). These techniques have been directly transferred to a total of 113 households in Hương Nguyên commune, A Lưới district (Thừa Thiên Huế province) and Nhơn Hưng ward, Nhơn Thọ ward, An Nhơn town and Vĩnh Sơn commune, Vĩnh Thanh district (Bình Định province) to apply in their livelihood models.
- 5 livelihood models were established including 1 model of growing A Lưới dwarf banana over 20 ha; 2 temperate vegetable growing models over 5 ha; 1 model of Ra Dư rice cultivated on 4.5 ha of acacia land with the average yield from 10-20 quintals/ha; 1 semi-intensive cow farming model with the participation of 21 households, 1 – 2 cows/households and 5 households who have cows as breed cattle. The area of Ra Dư rice field in 2018 was 0.5 ha and increased to 4 ha in 2019. Only 7 households participating in semi-intensive cow farming model in 2018 and now there were 14 households also joining this model.
- 3 conferences on successful production models were organized with the participation of 150 farmers for experience sharing.
- Production models of dwarf banana, temperate vegetable such as cabbage, chinese cabbage, radish and sweet pepper were developed and replicated to supply Big C supermarkets.
- The operation regulations for 02 co-operatives of An Nhơn and Vĩnh Sơn (Bình Định province) was established and applied .

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT TOWARDS VALUE CHAIN APPROACH

Contributions to communities and society:

- Developing sustainable agriculture towards value chain approach has enabled farmers to actively participate in production stages from input, production, harvest, processing and market connection.
- Advanced techniques have been applied in growing and taking care of temperate vegetable and dwarf banana.
- Communities have been promoted to produce eco-friendly and organic agricultural products, protect natural resources and minimize the use of synthetic pesticides, chemical fertilizers, and other chemical materials in farming.
- Market opportunities for local agricultural products have been created to increase income and improve livelihoods of farmers, especially the poor. For instance: the average income of households growing Ra Dư rice reached 10 -20 million dongs/ha; the average income of households with semi-intensive cow farming was 12 -15 million dongs/15-18-month-old calf.
- The model of Ra Dư rice cultivated on acacia land was introduced for the first time to ethnic minority people in Hương Nguyên commune, A Lưới district, Thừa Thiên Huế province that has contributed to preserve the indigenous Ra Dư rice and take advantage of acacia land for the first one or two years.
- One of major policies of A Lưới district on “Developing cow herds in the period of 2016 - 2026” was promoted to implement.

3 projects have been implemented:

- Project “Strengthening capacity on forest resources and biodiversity conservation in association with sustainable livelihood development for ethnic minorities living near the Saola Nature Reserve” funded by the Global Environment Facility and the Small Grants Programme of the United Nations Development Program in Vietnam.
- Project “Strengthening CSOs and CBOs to Accelerate Conservation Efforts in the Central Annamites” in Thua Thien Hue province funded by Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency.
- Project “Supporting small business holders comply with the timber legality requirements in order to effectively participate in national and global legal timber supply chains” funded by Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) under the FAO-EU FLEGT Programme.


NATURAL RESOURCES GOVERNANCE AND BIODIVERSITY PRESERVATION

Achievements:

- 532 people have benefited from activities in Quảng Trị, Thừa Thiên Huế and Đồng Nai provinces.
- 25 training courses were conducted on patrolling skills to protect community forests; techniques for rattan cultivation; first aid skill; applying technologies in community forest patrolling; introduction to the timber legality requirements. There were from 25-30 participants in each training.
- 2 networks was established including 17 members who are social organizations in Quảng Trị province (10 organizations) and Đồng Nai province (7 organizations) to support the implementation of the Voluntary Partnership Agreement - Forest Law Enforcement, Governance and Trade (abbreviated as VPA – FLEGT);
- 1 network of sustainable forest management and biodiversity preservation in Hương Nguyên commune (A Lưới district, Thừa Thiên Huế province) was operated with the participation of one community and 22 households.
- 1 model of growing Homalomena under natural forest canopy was developed for 22 ethnic minority households and one community whose livelihoods are dependent on forest resources in Hương Nguyên commune (A Lưới district, Thừa Thiên Huế province).
- 5 times of forest patrolling was conducted with the participation of 220 people to identify forest changes and forest threats over 2457 ha.

NATURAL RESOURCES GOVERNANCE AND BIODIVERSITY PRESERVATION

- 7 talk shows and conferences for experience sharing in livelihood models were organized with the participation of 140 people.
- 2 researches/surveys: “Evaluation of building and implementing the convention on forest management, protection and development in Thừa Thiên Huế province” and “rapid assessment on capacity building needs of stakeholders at provincial level to support enterprises in compliance with the legality definition, Vietnam timber legality assurance system and organization classification system” were conducted .
- Technical support for 18 timber processing enterprises and 35 household forest growers in Quảng Trị about timber legality requirements was provided to comply with VPA - FLEGT including: compliance with environmental policy; fire prevention and fighting; labour legislation and management and restoration of timber records.
- 15 filing cabinets and 45 document holders were provided for 15 timber processing enterprises in Quảng Trị province to test the records restoration of legal timber.
- 9 meetings were organized with 114 participants on introduction of VPA – FLEGT supportive network; introduction of timber legality requirements; experience sharing on survey activities and technical support to enterprises; and group performance review and evaluation.
- 1 consultation workshop on the Decree regulating the Vietnam Timber Legality Assurance System was organized .
- 2 articles about the VPA – FLEGT were published on the Vietnam Law Newspaper and The Banking Times.

Timber enterprises in Industrial Cluster of Ái Tử, Triệu Phong district, Quảng Trị province have been supported with occupational safety.



NATURAL RESOURCES GOVERNANCE AND BIODIVERSITY PRESERVATION

Contributions to communities and society:

- Communities, forest protection and management households, communal authority and Sub-Forest Protection Department in the project areas have cooperated and committed to implement coordination mechanism in forest management and protection.
- Communities have enthusiastically participated in forest protection and management. As a result, deforestation and illegal exploitation of forest products in these community forests have virtually disappeared.
- The model of growing Homalomena under natural forest canopy not only provides valuable herbal medicine to human but also food to wildlife; the model of Ra Dư rice cultivated on acacia has improved the efficiency of local land use to increase household income and reduce deforestation due to shifting cultivation.
- The studies have provided useful information and evidence for advocacy at Central and provincial level. One of outstanding results is that Thừa Thiên Huế provincial People's Committee issued the "Regulations of the community forest management of Thừa Thiên Huế province".

- The consultation workshops have collected stakeholders' suggestions in the development of the Decree regulating the Vietnam Timber Legality Assurance System (VNTLAS).
- Social organizations have played a major role in providing technical assistance to household forest growers and small timber processing enterprises so that they can effectively participate in domestic and international timber supply chains.
- Small and medium timber processing enterprises have been raised their awareness to better prepare for joining legal timber supply chains.

DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION

2 projects have been implemented:

- Project “Provide trainings and technical assistance on community based disaster risk/climate risk management and assessment to all the members of the technical assistance groups and community groups in 54 communes of Quảng Bình and Thừa Thiên Huế province” funded by Green Climate Fund - United Nations Development Programme.
- Project “Supporting a group of female rice growers in Hòa Đồng commune, Tây Hòa district, Phú Yên Province to cope with climate threats by implementing reduced input lotus growing livelihood model” funded by the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women)

Achievements:

- 5849 people including officials at commune and village levels and farmers have benefited from activities on community-based disaster risk/climate risk management and assessment in 7 communes in Thừa Thiên Huế province and 47 communes in Quảng Bình province and reduced input lotus growing livelihood model.
- 54 communes in Thừa Thiên Huế and Quảng Bình province were supported to assess and make plan for community-based disaster risk/climate risk management till the year 2022.
- 1 lotus growing model was established over 2.4 ha of low-yield rice field in Hòa Đồng commune (Tây Hòa district, Phú Yên province) for 13 households.

DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION

Contributions to communities and society :

- Officials at commune and village levels have been raised their capacity for disaster risk/climate risk management and assessment. They can apply the introduced tools and applications to assess and make plan for community-based disaster risk/climate risk management in their locality.
- The communities have used knowledge from the trainings to build up a reliable information system about disaster risk that serves as a base for local authority to widely implement the disaster prevention measures.
- The reduced input lotus growing livelihood model on low-yield rice field has brought financial and social success for beneficiaries. Lotus growers have applied knowledge from the training in production and product selling so the income form lotus field is higher than rice. The price for lotus seeds reach 18.000 dong\$ per kilo which is 5.000 dong\$ higher comparing with the rice price. Growing lotus can get an income of 3 million dong\$ / 500 m2 that is 3 or 4 times higher than rice.

GOOD GOVERNANCE - CHILD PROTECTION

1 project has been implemented:

Project “Strengthening the capacity of civil society organizations on Child Rights Governance” funded by Save the Children International.

Achievements:

- 3626 people have benefited from communication activities of the project.
- 67 people who are members of social organizations, teachers in secondary schools and official in relevant state agencies participated in 3 trainings on: skills for working with children; management and assessment of parents and children clubs; policy advocacy on child rights.
- Members of 5 good parents club and 7 children clubs have been strengthened their capacity in club operation, management and assessment of child rights implementation and application of positive discipline.
- 1 communication campaign “Spreading love” in 2019 attracted the participation of over 1000 local people and officials in state agencies.

GOOD GOVERNANCE - CHILD PROTECTION

- 51 people and 1 group participated in the competition for communication design products; 9 communication sessions was held at schools through multiple forms such as workshops, role-plays, quizzes on prevention of physical and humiliating punishment (PHP) against children and enhancing the self protection skills for children with the participation of 500 people.
- 1 workshop was organized to share experience among clubs in promoting the role of god parents club in ending PHP against children.
- 3 communication initiatives on prevention of PHP against children in schools and community were implemented in Đồng Hới city (Quảng Bình province) and Huế city (Thừa Thiên Huế province).
- 9 dialogues at school, district and city levels were conducted for children and state agencies on the themes of internet safety, accident and injury prevention; the right of children with disabilities to educational and vocational training.
- 3 documents was compiled and reprinted including reprinting 2 documents “Parents’ diary in educating children in modern time”; “Love ambassador” and one document “Talking with your child about child protection” were compiled.

GOOD GOVERNANCE - CHILD PROTECTION

Contributions to communities and society :

- Recommendations of social organizations and children collected from the dialogues have been considered by the authority. The People's Committees of Lộc Trì commune, Phú Lộc district and Kim Long ward, Huế city officially issued the establishment of Consulting group on child rights that is responsible for monitoring the physical and humiliating punishment (PHP) against children .
- Good parents clubs and core children clubs actively participated in monitoring the child rights implementation in order to prevent the PHP against children and promoting positive discipline in educating children.
- Through the dialogues, children in remoted areas, especially children with disabilities or those in social protection centers, etc could express their opinions and recommendations to the local authority so that the authority consider to design suitable programme or improve services to children.
- Social organizations participating in Child Rights Governance Network in Central Vietnam have been enhanced their knowledge in prevention of PHP against children, skills for working with children, project monitoring and evaluating to apply in their work.
- The creativity and initiative have been promoted in developing an environment free of violence for children by implementing initiatives at locality.
- Messages on child protection have been spread through social networks and mass media to change community's awareness on child protection.

GOOD GOVERNANCE - CHILD PROTECTION



“I think that children should be loved even when they make mistakes so that after all what they receive is not a whip but a lesson. I found difficult to control my temper and apply positive discipline at the beginning when facing my children’s bad behaviors, but step by step, I tried to keep the temper under control. I began to talk more with my kids instead of whipping, scolding or shouting at them. I gently show them what they have done wrong and how to fix it. As a result, my kids no longer feel frightened of my punishment and I become relaxed in educating my children”.

These words come from Ms. Nguyễn Thị Ngọc Anh (37 years old) who is a core member of the Good Parents Club in Kim Long ward (Huế city). She has changed herself for the happiness of her kids even though she used to frequently scold and whip her children in the past.

GENDER EQUALITY

2 projects have been implemented:

- Project “Supporting a group of female rice growers in Hòa Đồng commune, Tây Hòa district, Phú Yên Province to cope with climate threats by implementing reduced input lotus growing livelihood model” funded by the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women)
- Project “Promoting non-discrimination and inclusion of LGBT children and youths in Central Region of Vietnam” funded by Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development through the Canada Fund for Local Initiatives (CFLI).

Achievements:

- 370 people including teachers, students and parents have benefited from the project through activities to raise awareness on sexual orientation and gender identification that contribute to develop an LGBT-friendly environment.
- 2 seminars were organized in Huế city and Quảng Trị province with the participation of 60 LGBT young people and supporters.
- 20 people participated in one writing contest on the theme of “My story: Over the Rainbow”. The top six most inspirational works were honored at the awards ceremony with the presence of 60 representatives of LGBT communities in the Central. The amateur writers are members of LGBT youth communities and supporters in the Central.
- 1 communication event “Let the Rainbow Shine” attracted the participation 100 LGBT children, youth and supporters.
- 1 workshop on building LGBT friendly school environment was organized with the participation of 30 people who are representatives from state agencies and social organizations working with child rights.

GENDER EQUALITY

Contributions to communities and society :

- Women actively participate in generating family income. They play a major role in decision-making on agricultural production, product consumption and business planning. Typically in the lotus growing model, women are the main decision-maker of all activities in lotus production and they have good ideas to significantly contribute to improving the economy and raising the family's income.
- The participation and voices of LGBT youth have been enhanced and encouraged in the process of promoting anti LGBT discrimination and building a LGBT friendly environment for LGBT children and youth in schools and communities.

“It was my husband who made all decisions related to agricultural production before. Since I took part in trainings of the project, my knowledge about growing lotus has been improved. Now, I can make decisions in growing lotus on my own such as selecting seed lotus varieties for production, planting and harvesting time as well as technical requirements. I am so happy to fully participate in the decision-making process and contribute to the financial success from the lotus field for my family.”

PRESERVATION OF TRADITIONAL CULTURE

One activities has been integrated to implement:

- One thanksgiving festival to Giàng (God of Cơ Tu) of Hương Nguyên commune, A Lưới district was restored. This activity was integrated in the project “Strengthening capacity on forest resources and biodiversity conservation in association with sustainable livelihood development for ethnic minorities living near the Saola Nature Reserve” funded by the Global Environment Facility and the Small Grants Programme of the United Nations Development Program in Vietnam.

Achievements:

- 350 people including 50 children have benefited from the activity in Hương Nguyên commune.
- One thanksgiving festival to Giàng was restored after being faded away for 45 years.
- Traditional rituals in the festival such as: giving thanks when bad things was over and good things come; setting up “Cây Nêu” (a pole in the courtyard); folk songs; “tân tung za zá” folk dance; folk games which attracted all ages such as: tug of war, climbing fat column, competition for traditional cuisine among villages.
- 100% of local people voluntarily participated in the festival with the spirit of pride about the beauty of traditional culture in general and the “forest conservation” culture in particular, expressed through comments and shares on facebook pages.

PRESERVATION OF TRADITIONAL CULTURE

Contributions to communities and society :

- Messages on forest resource and wildlife protection were successfully included in the offering as a promise of the community to protect the forest. Sacrifices in the festival are no longer hunted animals or collected forest products but animals and plants that local people have produced. This action comes from a significant change in the perception and behavior of the community by committing to protect the forest.
- Young generation knows more about the rituals and good values of traditional cultural identity. The festival is not only for performances but also inspires the love to the cultural identity in generations of Hương Nguyên commune by voluntarily practicing folk songs, folk dance, learning original rituals and contributing to the festival restoration.

PRESERVATION OF TRADITIONAL CULTURE

“In spite of old age, I asked my children to take me here for the thanksgiving festival to Giàng. The spirit of Cơ Tu people is nourished through occasions like this. Before that, the patriarch and reputable villagers actively collected original rituals and selected the location, time to celebrate the festival”.
